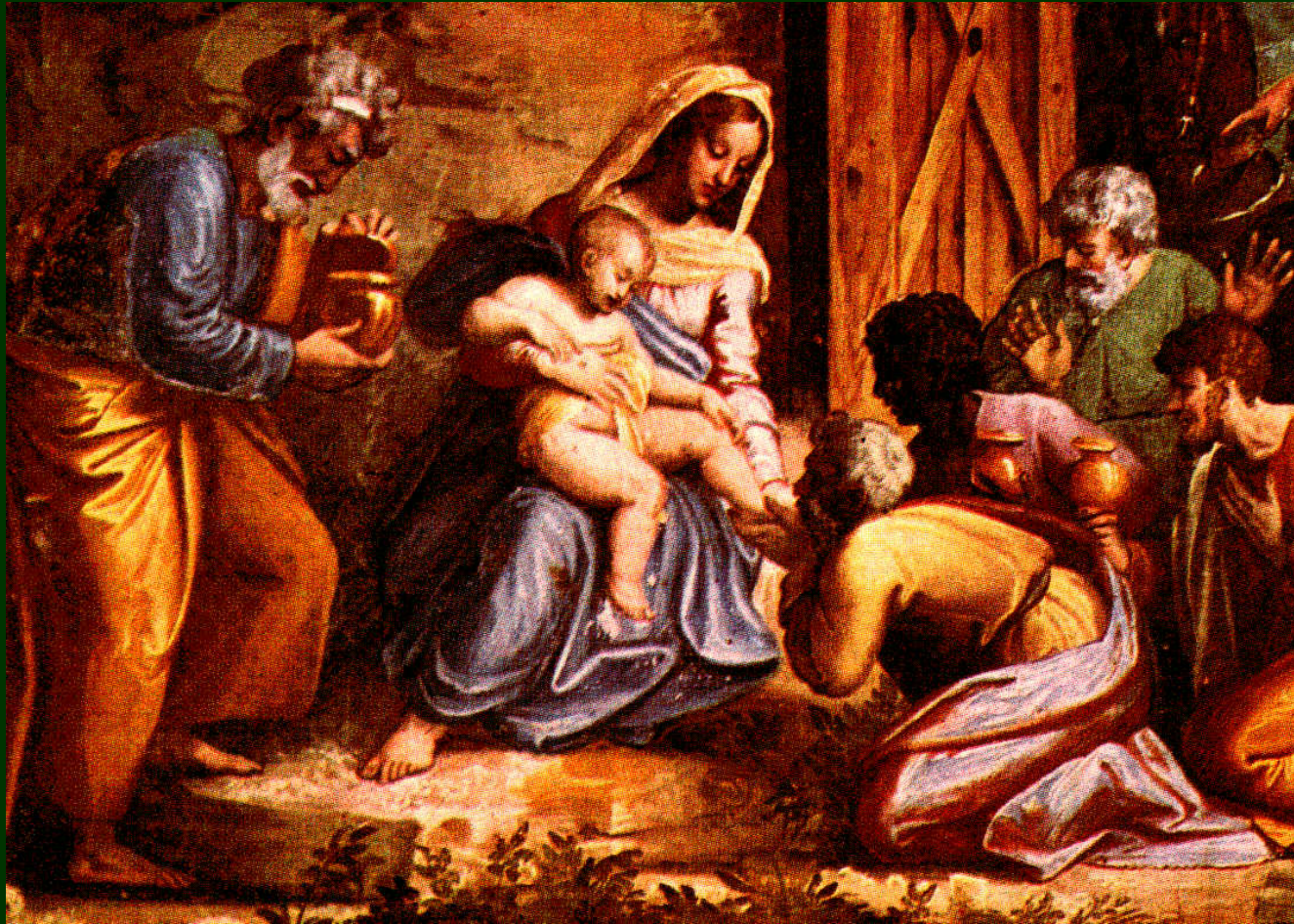
Father of all, we give you thanks and

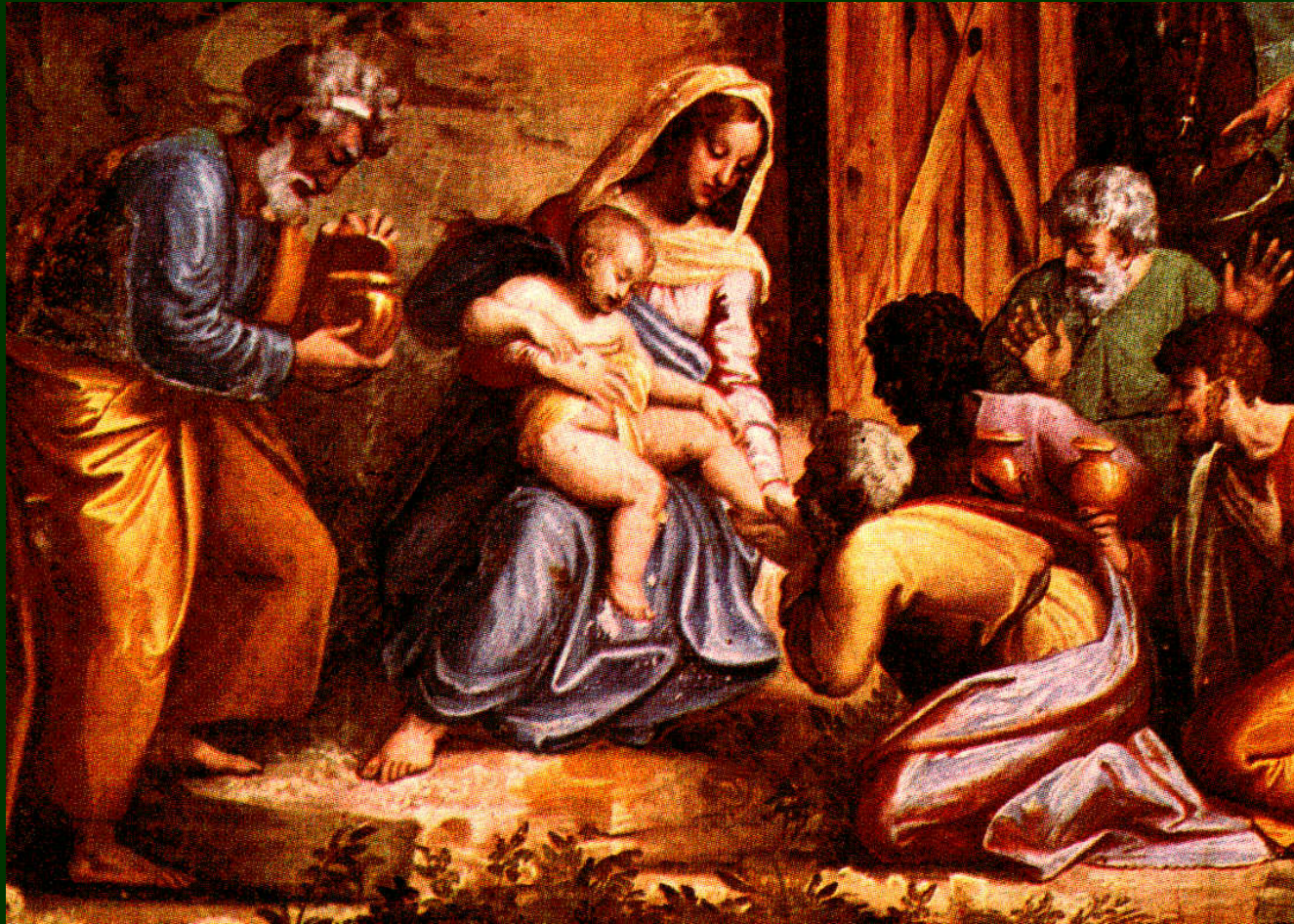

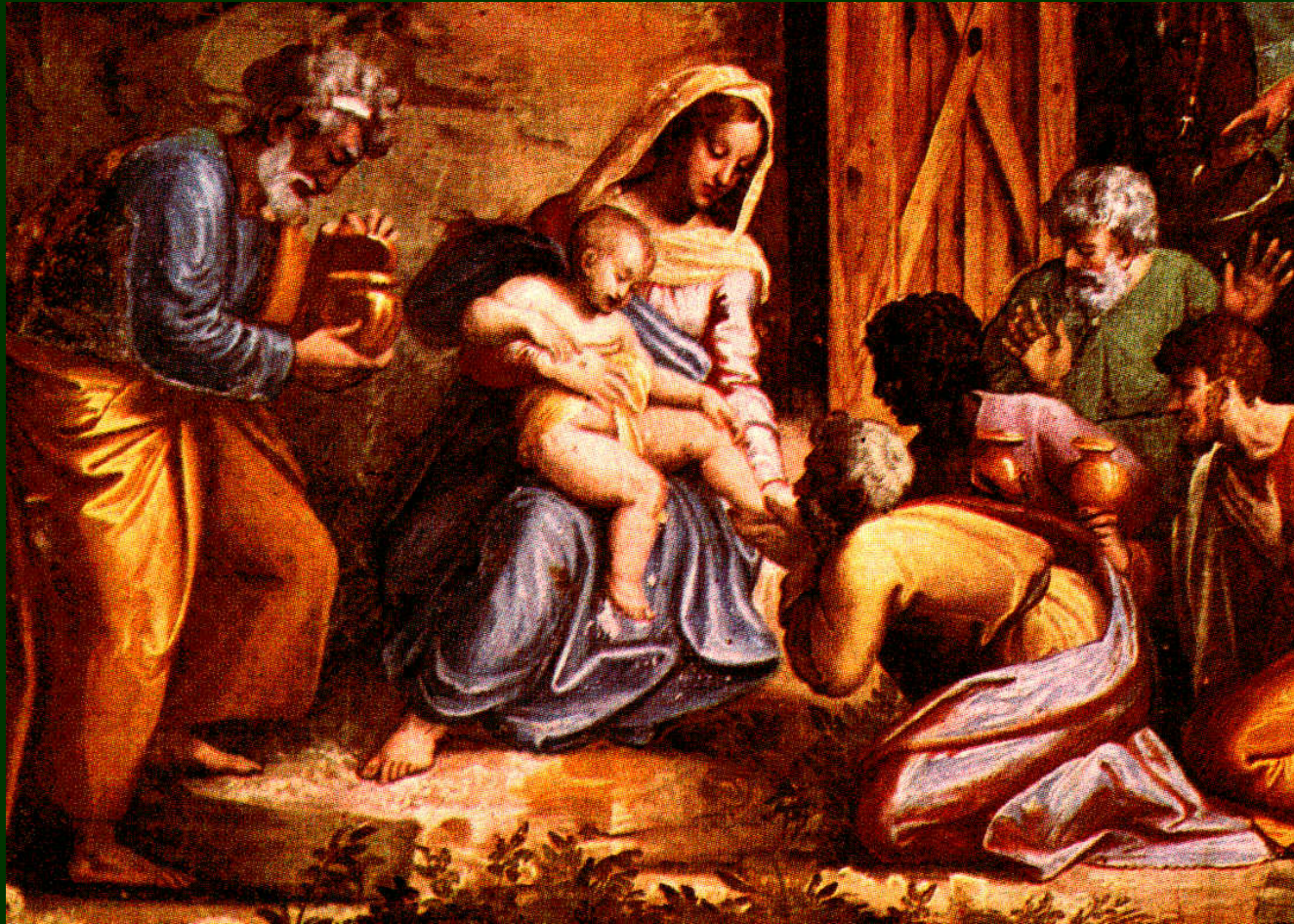
